





Introduction

roject UpLift is a free, intensive, small group, after-school tutoring program, targeted at struggling 1st through 4th grade readers attending 8 Title One schools in Boca Raton, Delray Beach and Boynton Beach. Title One schools are those schools where 75% or more of students receive free or reduced priced lunch.

Launched in 2017 at Pine Grove Elementary School in Delray Beach, the Project UpLift program has grown from serving 30 students at one school to serving 540 students at 8 schools in the 2021-2022 school year. The students served may not have a bed to sleep in, they may not have enough to eat at home and they may have parents for whom English is not the primary language.

Project UpLift is unique. The program is taught by certified teachers from the students' home school in small groups of 10 or less. The teachers are supervised by a literacy coach at each school, and Project UpLift is overseen by our Program Director to ensure quality and consistency. The teaching team is familiar with students' learning styles and challenges, and groups them to personalize learning according to student needs.

The most recent statistics show that only 54% of third grade students in Palm Beach County can pass the Florida Standards Assessment in reading. Our ultimate goal is to ensure that 90% of students attending the schools we serve are able to pass this crucial test. Literacy is the key that opens the door to academic success.



The Challenge

If You Can't Read, You Can't Learn: If you can't read by the end of third grade, you only have a 1 in 6 chance of catching up. According to figures provided by Florida Chamber of Commerce Business Alliance for Early Learning Report there were 444 third graders in the 8 schools we serve who were not reading at grade level at the last testing period in spring 2019. Principals believe that number may now have doubled. Here are some of the most important statistics from the National Institute for Literacy, National Center for Adult Literacy, The Literacy Company, and U.S. Census Bureau underscoring the critical need to address illiteracy in the United States:

- Currently, 45 million Americans are functionally illiterate and cannot read above a fifth-grade level
- 50% of adults cannot read a book written at an eighth-grade level
- Only 1/3rd of fourth-graders reach the proficient reading level
- 85% of juvenile offenders have problems reading
- 3 out of 5 people in American prisons can't read
- 3 out of 4 people on welfare can't read
